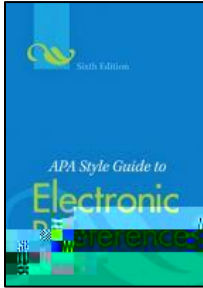

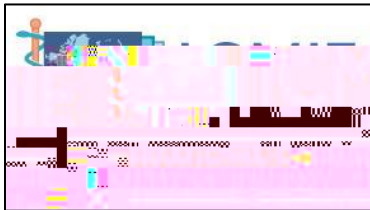
The American Psychological Association (APA) publication manual is the [style manual](#) of choice for writers, editors, students, and educators in psychological, social and health sciences literature (i.e. journals and texts). It provides invaluable guidance on all aspects of the writing process, from the ethics of authorship to the word choice that best reduces bias in language. The APA [quick guide](#) provides users with information about paper formats, citations, endnotes/footnotes, references and manuscript writing.

ICMJE formerly Uniform Requirements

The International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) developed these recommendations, formerly the Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts, to review best practice and ethical standards in the conduct and reporting of research and other material published in medical journals, and to help authors, editors, and others involved in peer review and biomedical publishing create and distribute accurate, clear, reproducible, unbiased medical journal articles.
