PART 1 – University of Victoria undergraduate admission

Academic Coursework & Grade Point Average

Comple on of 30 units at UVicor the equivalent in <u>transfer credits</u> from another ins tu on (UVic year 3 standing/the first two years of an undergraduate degree/competed undergrad degree).

Notes: 1.5-units is a single term course at UVic so 30 units is the equivalent of 20 single term courses. 27 units are technically year 3 standing at UVic, but if you are chosen for the program with this number of units or transfer credits you would be required to complete addi onal courses. If you took your courses in BC, use the BC Transfer Guide to see if your courses transfer to UVic.

SOCW 200A and **SOCW 200B**, or equivalents must be completed or in progress at the me of applica on. These courses can be in addi on to, or part of, the 30 units. More informa on below.

A minimum of a 3.5 on the UVic 9-point scale (approxed 0.003.aou (20))

Notes: See the <u>UVic GPA conversion guide and grade scale conversion table</u> if your school uses a dierent grading scale. In certain cases, a human service diploma average may be used in the calcula on instead.
