

COURSE PLANNING FOR 2023 BSW ADMITS

It is the responsibility of each student to plan their BSW Program to ensure that they will fulfill the University and the School degree completion requirements.

This form is intended as a guide for your course planning. For official documentation and degree planning please access your 'CAPP report/Degree Evaluation' via your Uvic Online tools.

Requirements for completion of the BSW Degree include the following:

- 1. Social Work 200A & 200B or equivalents
- 2. UVic's Academic Writing Requirement
- 3. 60 units in total. If you enter the program with 30 units, you will require 2 general electives in order to obtain 60 units. The general electives may be any year level.
- 4. 27 units must be 3rd and 4th year social work courses (these can include HSD courses as electives as indicated below). 9 of these units are field education courses.

FREQUENTLY ASKED COURSE PLANNING QUESTIONS

How long do I have to complete the program?

We do not have a time limit for completion. Typically, students take 5-6 terms. However, you can take a shorter or longer time depending on how you want to program plan. See the School of Social Work policies on maintaining your status as a BSW student.
