How to Complete the ENSH Minor/ General Program with ENGL Courses

In the table below, you will find the ENSH Minor requirements and the corresponding ENGL courses that will fulfill those requirements. A red arrow () indicates that an ENSH course is the same as an ENGL course, which makes them mutually exclusive; you cannot receive credit for both. For example, if you have already taken ENGL 366B - Shakespeare: Histories and Tragedies you cannot get additional credit for ENSH 353 Shakespeare: Histories and Tragedies. If there is no red arrow, you can get credit for ENGL courses and ENSH courses. For instance, you can get credit for both ENGL 433A Modern Irish Literature and ENSH 372 Contemporary Literature in Britain and/ or Ireland.
