HSTR 378 A01 History of the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict subject to change

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Course Outline: The subject of this course is the struggle over Palestine/Israel, from the origins of Zionism in the late [†]9century to the negotiated agreements that emerged from the Osto peace process of the 1990s. Major themes to be discussed include: the Ottoman legacy; the structures of British colonialism; the processes of-**batlding** and statebuilding; the role played by regional and international actors; the broader context of socioeconomic changes; the mobilization of religious groups; and, the possibilities (such as they are at present) for **reitation**. In discussing the same other themes, close attention will be paid to historiographical issues.

We will also beclosely following current events. In frequent, if not regular, **somalup** discussions, students will be required to present and assess articles from the internet and the printed media, as well as participate, thoughtfully and respectfully, in a thorough discussion and analysis of current affairs.
