
Course Description:

The aim of this course is to introduce students to a variety of controversial moral issues in contemporary society. In particular, students will be encouraged to careful learn how to articulate their opinions in the most persuasive way possible. The issues we will address in the course include the following: the ethics of genetic engineering, the basis for our obligation to protect the environment, the moral status of abortion, the duty to help alleviate global poverty, the ethics of prostitution, the distinctive wrong of colonization, and the possible decriminalization of addictive recreational drugs. Class participation will be strongly encouraged in order to generate thoughtful discussion of the philosophical arguments proposed in the readings and their application to current events.
