Students who wish to stop out under the sove regulation must notify the Associate Dean as soon as possible and formally request ermission to stop out. Although the regulations do not specify the grounds on which permission
to be granted or denied, the student's reasons for wishing to stop

: Stopping out may render you ineligible to receive scholarship and in-course prize funding because University regulations generally require that a student be returning full time to the Faculty in the next session. If you think this regulation may affect your situation, consult the Associate Dean or Student Awards and Financial Aid (https://www.uvic.ca/registrar/safa/contact/index.php).
: If you have applied for or have been awarded a bursary for any portion of the academic session of which you are now planning to stop out, contact the Faculty's Financial Aid Officer (lawfao@uvic.ca) to discuss the effect of the stop out on your bursary funding. Stopping out will likely mean that a part of your bursary will be withdrawn.
Stopping out may affect your health insurance coverage. Please contact the UVic Students Society (uvssinfo@uvss.ca ; 250-721-8355) to determine the impacts of stopping out on your health coverage system.
