The mandate at MOSAIC Community Health is entirely Social Prescription and referrals come from health care practitioners such as doctors and nurses in the community, as well as referrals coming from discharge plans from Burnaby hospital. Our partners include Fraser Health, Allied Health, Burnaby PCN, and sometimes, self-referrals.

Our clients in social prescription are those who are 65+, isolated, and frail. The vision is to support the clients to maintain independence and social wellness for as long as possible.

The social prescription for seniors is not unique in Burnaby. In fact, there are "Community Connectors" for each city in Greater Vancouver Area – all managed by United Way.

In Burnaby, historically, there is only one Community Connector for about four years now, and only this new fiscal year have they added 2 more for the city as the need increased significantly – two in MOSAIC, one from Burnaby Neighbourhood House. MOSAIC's work with many community-based organizations are very collaborative, as well as with United Way and Fraser Health.

The model used for Social Prescription in Burnaby has a volunteer-based component as well, and so in this program, we make sure that our volunteers have the appropriate tools in their onboarding before they will be ready for community involvement.

Current challenges: Top issues of our clients: language barrier, housing (!), and meal support.

*The current Community Connector's role is going above and beyond his scope because seniors are at risk and vulnerable to losing what they have. The community connector work study opportunity will assist in creating and implementing a wellness plan working with community. Strengthen engagement with vulnerable communities and implementation and knowledge transfer of social prescribing for vulnerable seniors. Work with primary care sector and MOSAIC to strengthen wellness planning and tools related to social prescribing and other wellness interventions and initiatives.*
