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"Lessons Learnt from PAndAS: Cosmic Evolution and the Great Plane of Dwarfs"

<u>Abstract</u>

Halos of large galaxies contain the fossil remnants of their formation, filled with tidal debris of accreted systems. Through the Pan-Andromeda Archaeological Survey (PAndAS) we have uncovered these extremely faint streams and shreds around our nearest cosmic neighbour, the Andromeda Galaxy. Here, I will present some of the key results from PAndAS, showing how it confirms our hierarchical picture of galaxy evolution. However, I will also show how the presence of an unexpectedly ordered dance of dwarf galaxies around Andromeda challenges this picture, and maybe even the laws of physics themselves.
