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“Constraints on the Progenitors of Type Ia Supernovae from Observations at Late Times”

Abstract

In this talk I will discuss recent advances in the observational techniques used to understand the progenitor systems of Type Ia supernova, a powerful cosmological standard candle. I will focus the role of optical observations at very late times, such as the analysis of nebular-phase spectra, searching for emission from an impacted companion star 3 years after the explosion, and deep post-explosion HST imaging for extremely low-mass host galaxies.
