COURSE OUTLINE GEOGRAPHY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course introduces students to the physical and human geographies of this land now known as British Columbia. Beyond a simple identification of geographic "facts", the course will push you to think critically, creatively, and multi-perspectivally, engaging with historic and pressing issues and struggles central to the province's social experience. Through engaging lectures, readings, videos, podcasts, and group discussions, this course will provide you a more sophisticated appreciation of the place you presently call home and of the importance of a creative, critical geographic education.

COURSE FORMAT

The expectation is that this course will be delivered in a regular way with face-to-face lectures. However, given the continuing uncertainty around the pandemic, the course may need to be adapted. Lecture notes will be posted, but attending all sessions will help you grasp the nuance of the material.
