

Where The Wild Things Are: Marine Bird Distributions, Densities, and Assessments of Risk on Canada's Pacific Coast

Tens of millions of marine birds use Canada's Pacific coast for critical activities such as breeding, foraging, over wintering and migration, including multiple species listed under Canada's Species at Risk Act. Despite the diversity and uniqueness of this marine bird community, significant knowledge gaps regarding the at-sea distribution and density of marine birds remain.
