This assignment can be completed individually in groups of up to 4 students.

An important part of this course requires you to think critically about the course materials and to integrate information from the course and the textbook in a concise manner. You will be asked to choose a topic with a specific problem and apply theories from adolescent psychology to present a solution in a paper that is 1800-2100 words. Assignments will be uploaded to the Assignments feature in Brightspace. Additional information will be provided in class and on Brightspace.

Generally, late submissions will be accepted but every 24 hours that it is late, there will be a 5% reduction on your final mark. For example, if you receive 75% on your assignment, and submit it 48 hours late, your final score on the assignment will be 75% - (2 days x 5%/day) = 65%.
