Meeting the minimum GPA does not guarantee admission to UVic. For many programs the competitive average is higher, so not all qualified applicants will be admitted. You must complete at least 12 units in order to be classified as a second-year UVic student, and 27 units or more to be classified as a third-year student. Programs may also require you to complete specific coursework in order to enter UVic with second or third-year standing.

Faculty of Education

Kinesiology

Minimum GPA required: 5.0 on UVic's 9-point scale.

- ATWP 135/ENGL 135, ENGL 146, ENGL 147, ENGL 225, ENSH 101, ENSH 102, ENSH 202 or any ATWP-designated course that meets the AWR requirement
- EPHE 141
- EPHE 160
- MATH 100 or 102 or 109
- Additional 3.0 units of science (from BIOL, CHEM, MATH, PHYS, STAT 255, EPHE 242)
- 1.5 units of additional course work

All requirements for admission must be completed by **March 30**.

Recreation and Health Education/ Physical & Health Education

Minimum GPA required: 4.0 on UVic's 9-point scale.

- ATWP 135/ENGL 135, ENGL 146, ENGL 147, ENGL 225, ENSH 101, ENSH 102, ENSH 202 or any ATWP-designated course that meets the AWR requirement
- 9.0 units of additional course work

All requirements for admission must be completed by **March 30**.

Teacher Education: Elementary Curriculum

Minimum GPA required: 3.0 on UVic's 9-point scale.

- 3 units of approved English
- 3 units of approved Canadian studies
- 3 units of approved laboratory science
- 3 units of approved mathematics
- 3 units of approved electives courses
- an interview may be required

All requirements for admission must be completed by **March 30**.

Faculty of Engineering and Computer Science

Biomedical, Civil, Computer, Electrical, Mechanical and Software

Minimum GPA required: 3.0 on UVic's 9-point scale. Must include

- CHEM 101 or 150
- MATH 100 or 109, and 101, and 110 or 211
- CSC 110 or 111
- ATWP 135/ENGL 135
- PHYS 110 and 111
- no individual course grade less than "C"

— If you have completed an engineering technology diploma program in mechanical, electrical, computer or software engineering, and have an overall average of 5.0 or better, you should consider the Engineering Bridge program offered by Camosun College. If you complete the Bridge program with a GPA of 5.0 or better, you will be eligible to enter year three of UVic's Engineering program.

Computer Science

Minimum GPA required: 3.0 on UVic's 9-point scale.

- CSC 110 or 111
- CSC 115 or 116
- MATH 101

Must have obtained a minimum grade of "C" in all program-required CSC-, SENG- and MATH- transferable courses.

Faculty of Fine Arts

Minimum GPA required: 2.0 on UVic's 9-point scale

Additional program requirements:

- Art History and Visual Studies: none
- Music (BMus): audition
- Music and Computer Science: portfolio
- Theatre: supplemental application
- Visual Arts: portfolio
- Visual Arts and Computer Science: portfolio
- Writing: WRIT 100 with at least "B"

Faculty of Human and Social Development

Child and Youth Care

Minimum GPA required:

- 12 units of university transfer courses with 3.0 on UVic's 9-point scale or a human services diploma from a recognized institution with 5.0 on UVic's 9-point scale
- Supplemental application required

Computer Science and Health Information Science

Minimum GPA required: 4.0 on UVic's 9-point scale.

Public Health

- 12 units of university transfer courses with 4.0 on UVic's 9.0 scale
- Pre-calculus 11 or Foundations of Math 12 (or the equivalent)
- Supplemental application required.

Health Information Science

Minimum GPA required: 4.0 on UVic's 9-point scale.

Foundations of Mathematics 12 or Pre-Calculus 12 (or the equivalent)

Nursing ()

Minimum cumulative GPA required: 3.0 (on UVic's 9-point scale) and a grade of C or higher in any core nursing courses.

Social Work

Minimum GPA required: 3.5 on UVic's

The courses you take at your college or university may count toward your UVic degree. [uvic.ca/transfer](#)

If you are transferring from a BC college, the BC Transfer Guide lists course-by-course equivalencies. In some cases, block credit agreements have been established for specific diploma programs to transfer to specific UVic degree programs. Use the BC Transfer Guide ([uvic.ca/transfer](#)) and our program-planning worksheets ([uvic.ca/transfer](#)) to plan courses that are likely to transfer to your degree at UVic. For information on submitting your transcripts see [uvic.ca/transfer](#).

After you receive your admission offer, you'll receive a separate email with your transfer credit summary. This will list the transfer credit for all of your transferable courses, but there is a limit of 30 units that can be used toward your UVic degree.

You must complete at least 30.0 of your minimum 60.0 required units at UVic (or UVic exchange). Within these 60.0 units, 21.0 units must be upper-level (300/400-level) courses, and 18.0 of those 21.0 units must be taken at UVic. There may be additional residency requirements for your chosen program(s).

Apply for admission at [uvic.ca/transfer](#). The deadline to apply for fall 2024 entry is January 31.

Submit your transcripts, proof of English language proficiency (if applicable) and supplemental materials (if required). Supplemental materials may include a resume, essay or a portfolio depending on which program you're applying to. In-progress transcripts are required at the time of application and you will usually have an option to upload them once you've received an introductory email from your admission assistant. Final official transcripts must be sent directly to UVic.
