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- 4) Consider restoring funding for two ear MAs. Currently, CSPT Conc MA students receive one year of funding. It is becoming rare for current MA students to remain at University of Victoria, choosing to pursue PhDs elsewhere. CSPT has been put in the possition and their 2 year MA requirements to one year, but Sociology, for example, has retained it work and Ma. Meanwhile, English has chosen to pursue the gen MA, and History has also embraced the non-thesis option. These discrepancies should be addressed.
- 5) CSPT has responded to this difficulty nimbly by creating a "summer theory school" and a capstone paper, but the reviewers feel that a second year of MA funding must be restored in order to protect the rigour and value of the program. The revi**esvre**cognize that the revision of the MA could be retained, but that the twoear MA with thesis should remain part of its roster of offerings.
- 6) Consider providing stable, base funding to CSPT; currently, we understand that CSPT relies exclusively on discretionary funding;
